President – Rick Dawson

In looking back at the last 12 months it is important to look at the accomplishments of our organization. As of September 1st over 300 additional boys and girls are participating in soccer under the T-CYSA umbrella. Most of those are coming at our youngest level which bodes well for our future and for the physical fitness of our youth. Most of this increase can be attributed to the tireless efforts of our Club Directors, Greg Grogan, Lisa Seed, Ryan Neilsen and Angela Hendricks. These recreational program directors do the work of recruiting coaches, dividing the registered boys and girls into area teams and generally organizing, as many as 68 teams in one club. The time and dedication donated to our children is astounding. T-CYSA soccer wouldn't happen without them.

This year we also accomplished the verification process of over 2300 birth certificates of our registered players allowing us to issue player cards for all of our players. We are one of the few Associations substantially in compliance with Washington Youth Soccer's mandate to have player cards for all players. In addition it should be reported that 100% of our coaches have a risk management number symbolizing the passing of a background check to insure that our children are safe. We can thank Teresa Obenauer, our Office Manager and Teri Ahlers for insuring that this task was completed.

Many other items were accomplished including a complete reorganization of Complex fields to address wear and tear, replacement of worn equipment, and an enormously successful volunteer work day this fall to make the complex ready for league play.

These successes do not mean that this year was without its challenges as the Board of Directors did not start nor finish the year with each position filled. The recruitment of volunteers in every aspect of this organization remains difficult, board members, coaches, field help, concession stand, and office assistance are just a few of the areas that we are constantly in need of people.

Your board of directors are a tireless group that are dedicated to our children., In addition to their board duties they also coach, work concessions, set up the fields, repair the equipment, keep the website up to date, referee, and even empty the garbage on the weekends. They work very diligently at ensuring players are registered correctly and that the necessary documentation is accounted for so that there are fewer issues down the path. Albert Montelongo is our Fields and Maintenance person who works to keep the lines on our playing fields as well as general maintenance of the soccer complex. If you see him you might thank him for his continued assistance.

Greg Thomas continues to donate his time and expertise by keeping up our website and adding new sections. Please remember to check the website and remind your parents to continue to check it also! If you see Greg – thank him for all he does in keeping our site current.

Concession Stand: Christopher Clem, as well as myself, provide updated current food worker cards. We are always looking for volunteers to help man the stand. So please feel free to contact the office or myself at skoerner_1@charter.net to volunteer for a shift to assist in keeping costs down. Please encourage your team to volunteer as this assists in supporting the association with an on-going fund raiser for T-CYSA. A big thank you to all the volunteers who repeatedly volunteer at the concession stand as well as Christopher Clem!

Volunteer Options: I am hoping to head a fundraiser this year and also a sponsorship program. I would appreciate any and all assistance in this venue with organizing, letter folding and envelop stuffing, as well as any help with contacting local businesses and calling. So many times we put out the word that we need new Board Members or help with certain projects and it is the same people every time who step up. Most of our Board members are already coaches so they are doing two jobs for this association. My question is: where are the other parents and why aren't they helping? As a coach, you can require parents from your team to step up and volunteer.

VP of Development – Greg Thomas

Center of Excellence

Our 16th annual Center of Excellence was held Mondays from March 10 to April 28.

Approximately 125 U10-U11 players attended the camp.

The coaching staff included 11 coaches and 15 assistant coaches. The assistant coaches, most of whom were Three Rivers or Columbia Basin College players, were each paired with a coach to supervise and mentor them. By giving our older players an opportunity to learn how to coach while they are still actively playing, we hope to encourage them and make it easier for them to coach later on.

Gear for the participants was delivered correctly, on time. Most of the gear for the coaches was also delivered on time, but we had trouble getting correct sizes even though we had been told the sizes were in stock. It took over 9 months for the last coaching gear to arrive.

Coaching Classes

We held 7 coaching classes this year: 4 in the spring and 3 in the fall. A total of 86 coaches attended the classes; 61 were T-CYSA coaches. The counts of T-CYSA and total coaches attending class are as follows:

- spring U8: 14/14
- spring U10: 7/8
- spring E: 12/24
- spring D: 5/17
- fall U6: 7/7
- fall U8: 9/9
- fall U10: 7/7

Mike Washington taught the E and D classes. Greg Thomas taught the U6, U8, and U10 classes.

Online Coaching Tool

We continued to provide an online resource from Byte Size Coaching to help our coaches plan training sessions. The vendor is currently rolling out the next generation of the site; it should be available by spring 2009.

The tool has features that make it useful for novice coaches as well as experienced coaches. For example, a novice coach can look at an entire season of complete training session plans; he/she can then simply organize the activities described in the plans, and the kids will learn and improve by playing in the activities, even if the coach is inexperienced. On the other hand, a veteran coach who knows his/her older team needs to work on the tactical aspects of shooting, for example, can use the tool's search feature to get a list of games that address that topic.

A new feature included in the tool is an online learning program for first-time soccer coaches. It contains video clips of practice sessions, tests, and answers. It takes less than one hour to

complete the entire program, but you can also do it one part at a time; each part takes 10-15 minutes. Although this program is targeted at first-time soccer coaches, most coaches will benefit by reviewing it. To access this program, click the "First-Time Coaches" link in the navigation panel of the tool.

Coaching Questions and Answers Sessions

We held 2 sessions for coaches in September, during which they could discuss soccer issues and get questions answered. Senior coaches attended to participate in the discussions and offer advice. Participants felt the sessions were worthwhile, but only 2 coaches attended each session.

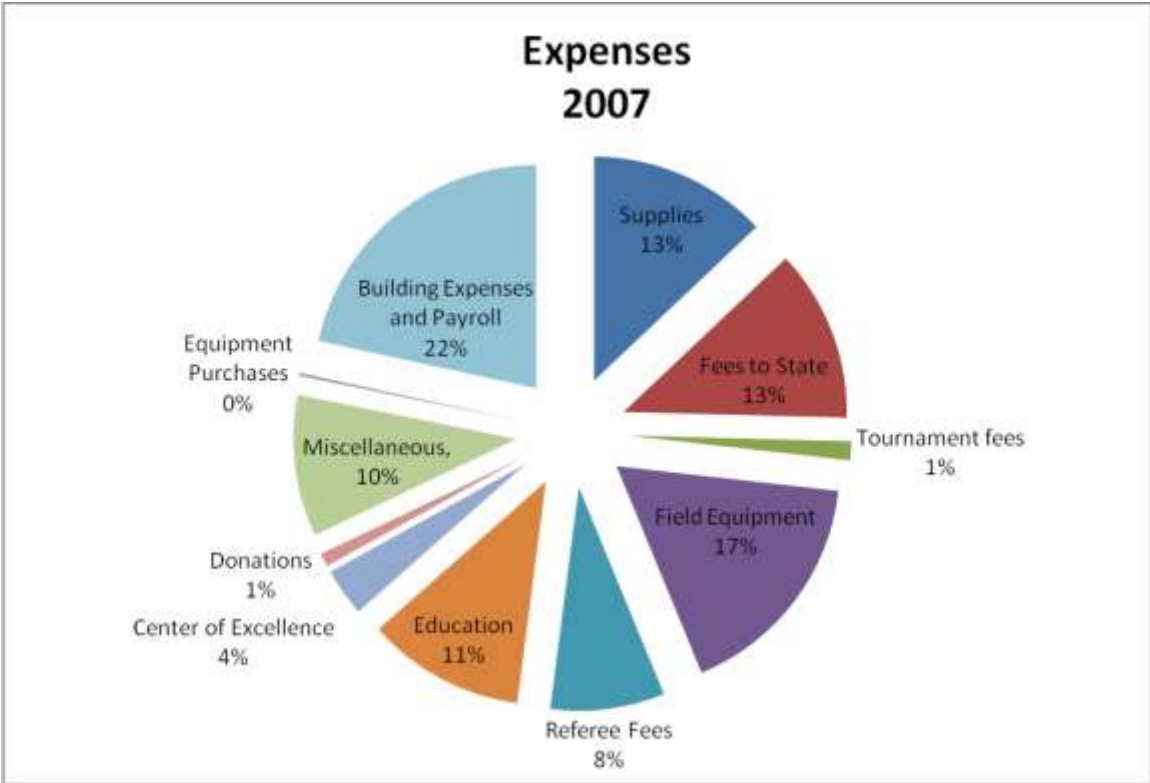
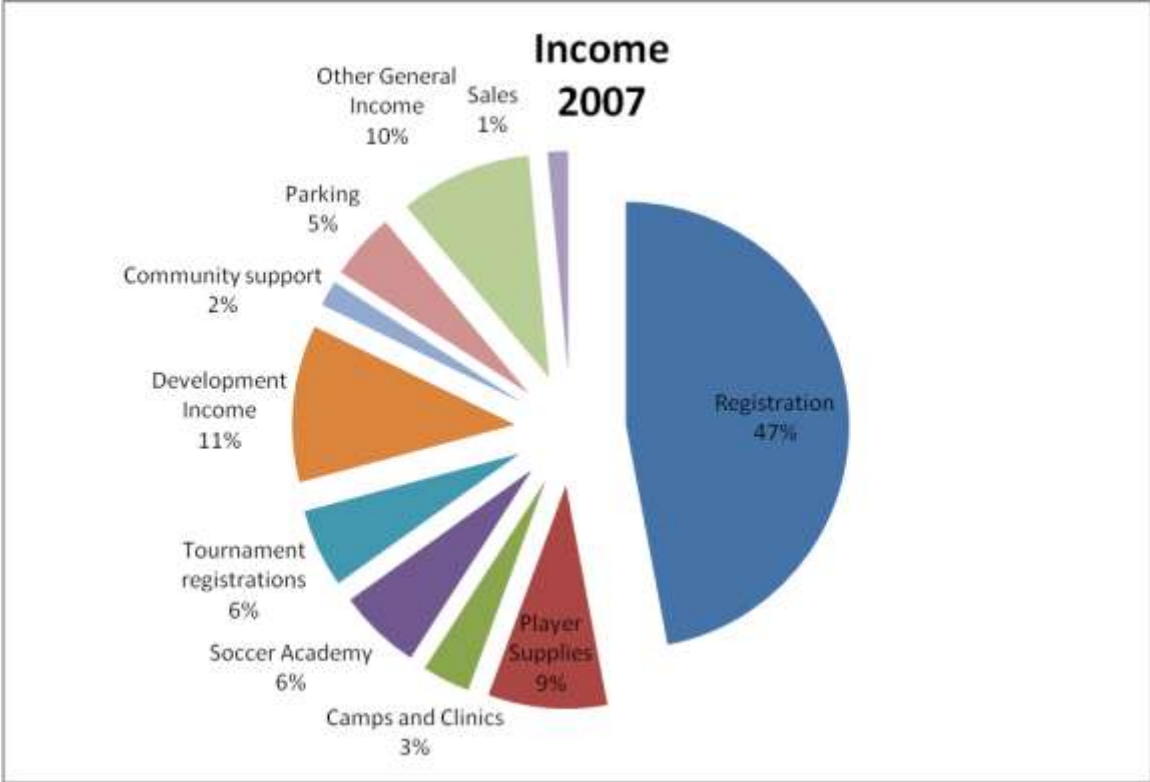
2007 Year End Reporting

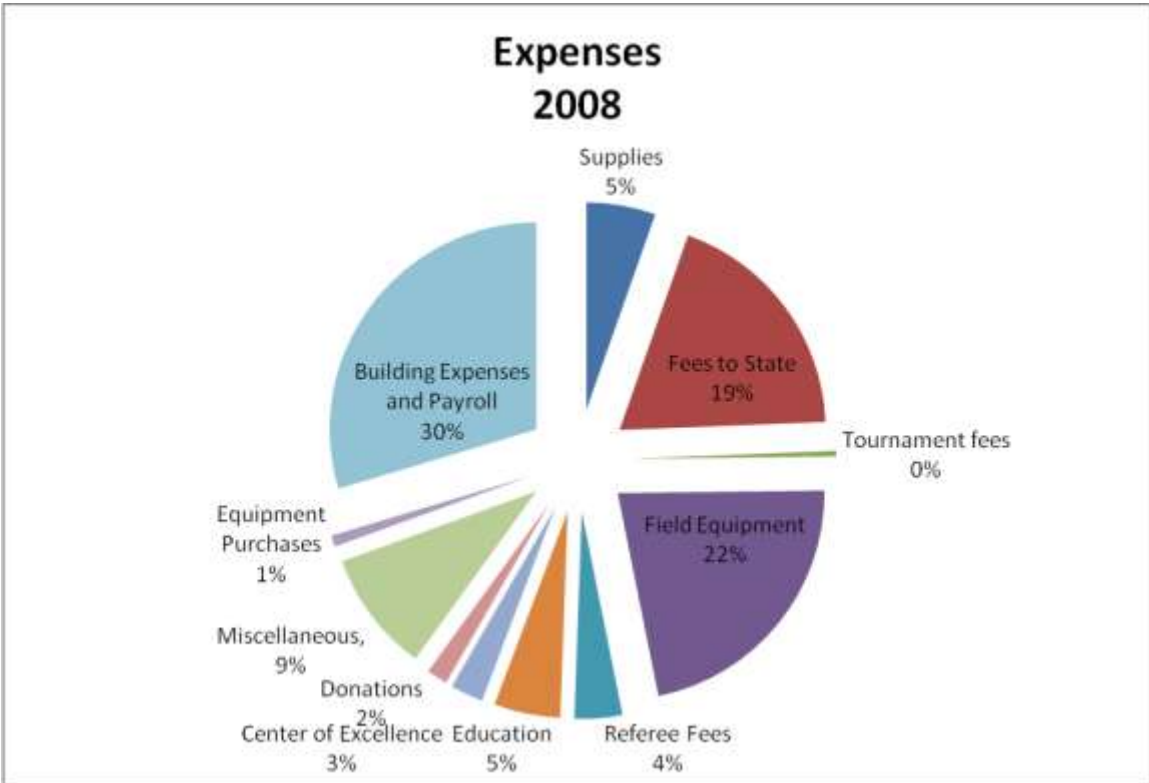
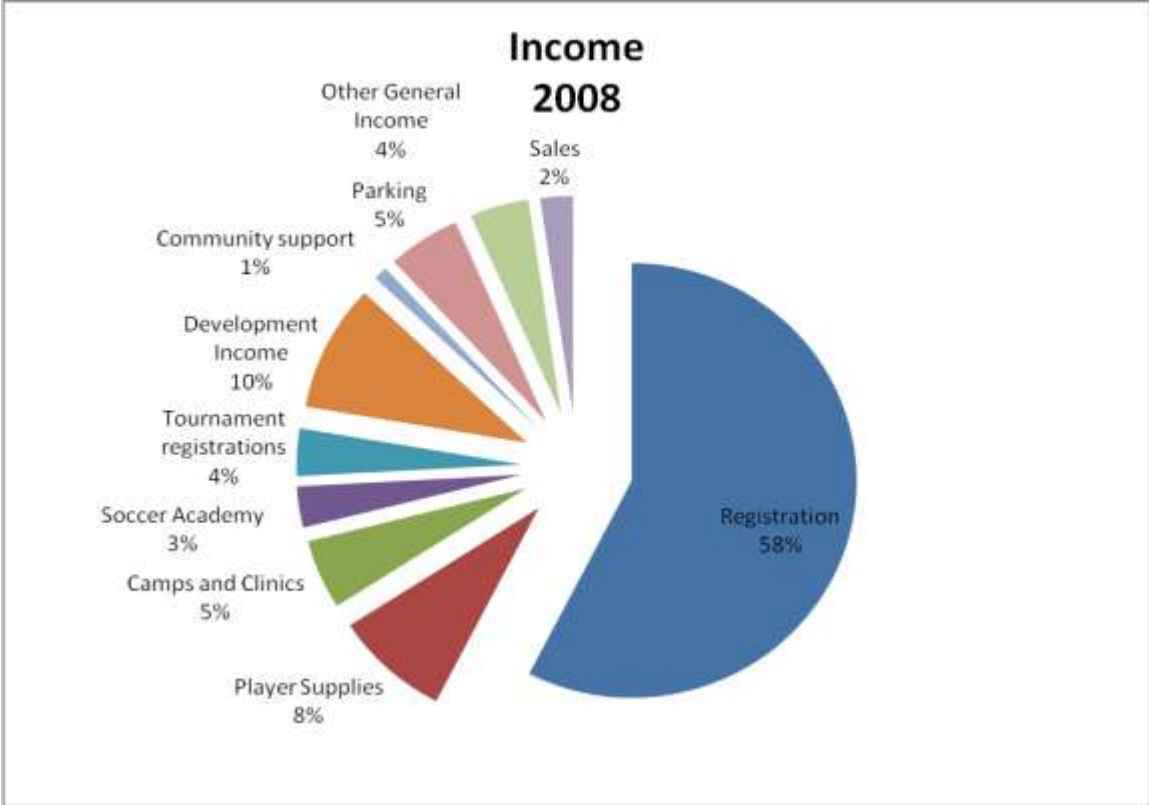
As reported at the 2007 AGM meeting the Association had a gross income of \$321,076 with operating costs of \$341,620 for a net loss of \$30,504. This is after end of year adjustments for depreciation. The depreciation for the year was 32,568 which accounted for the net loss.

2008 Reporting

A comparison of our income between last year and this shows that as of the 31st of October we had a net increase of \$53,779 over the same period last year. Our expenses paid are up this year due to having already paid our field rental and the majority of the recreational uniform bills. This will be reduced however by payments that are pending of about \$19,000 for the balance due on recreational uniforms for the fall season, and approximately \$12,000 in referee fees. The loss of income from tournaments and the associated income from parking continues to impact the bottom line. It is expected that the depreciation calculation will not be as large this year as most of our equipment has been fully depreciated at this point, and thus we may show a slight profit this year.

This past year we actually developed a budget and have been able to compare our expenditures and income to our best estimate. This was a major improvement over past years where the budget consisted of paying bills and hoping we had enough income to cover the needs.

VP of Competition – vacant

This position was vacant at the start of the year and scheduling of the Spring 2008 season was completed graciously by Rob Winston and the season was completed successfully.

During the March through July time period Mike Nolan filled this position responding to all concerns regarding competition during the spring season. Mike stepped down in August.

The schedule for the fall season that was just completed was prepared by Fred Olson and again was completed successfully.

Not to say that each season and our scheduling is without struggles. It is difficult to schedule teams where a volunteer coaches more than one team. We added U-14 players to the recreational leagues with a new U-13/14 Coed division commencing this fall.

Goals for this position for the upcoming year include:

- A complete update to the recreational rules of competition to comply with current Washington Youth Soccer standards.
- Working with the Tri-City Soccer Referee Association to train and recruit new officials.
- Complete a parent code of ethics to insure respect and courtesy is given to all coaches, opponents and officials.

Director of Tournaments – Ed Carnes

We have had a very successful year. In February we leased our complex for the Blue Mountain Exchange Tournament, and made approximately \$2,000. In May we hosted the Spring Jamboree, and had approximately 65 teams participate. In June we hosted the LPT tournament, and made approximately \$8,500. In November we hosted the Fall Jamboree, and set a record on the number of teams that participated, which were over 90 teams. In 2009 we will still have the Blue Mountain Exchange Tournament where we will make over \$5,000 this year. We will work hard to increase the number of teams for the Spring and Fall Jamborees. We are very excited to announce that we have won the bid for the U.S. Youth Soccer Regional President's Cup for 2009 to be held the second weekend of June. The LPT Tournament will no longer be held in June, it will be probably moved to July or August. We will bid on the LPT Tournament to try to host it. None of this would have been possible if it wasn't for the hard work from Teresa and Teri in the office, Rick Dawson, Greg Grogan, Tom Brewer, Albert Montelongo, and Scott Ruff.

Director of Communications – *Vacant*

This position was vacant at the start of the year and again vacant as of the first of October.

January and February newsletters were developed as cooperative effort among the board and paid staff.

Elizabeth Hill filled this position from March through early September and arranged for Northwest Sports Photography take team pictures and the added duty of recreational player cards.

Elizabeth handled many of the advertising and publicity needs for the 3-Rivers Soccer Club.

Goals for this board position for the coming year:

- Provide regular communications to all members of T-CYSA.
- Improve media coverage for our competitive programs.
- Establish a means to obtain regular public service announcements on radio and video media.

Webmaster –Greg Thomas

Web site tasks accomplished since November 2007 include:

- Began researching web site hosting providers in preparation for switching to a new provider. Our current provider stopped giving us free hosting when they transferred our account to a different Internet Service Provider.
- Continued updating content as usual: schedules, meetings, clinics, events, registration, tryouts, tournaments, State Cups, Center of Excellence, web site links, field maps, etc.

Our website has had 1,044,825 page views in 243,405 visits as of October 31 and is averaging 163 visits per day.

Three Rivers Soccer Club Director (TRSC) – Chris Smith

2008 has been a tumultuous year for the 3-Rivers Soccer Club with a new Coaching Director coming on board in March and a less than successful 2007 resulting in our removal from the PDL.

Staff

Chad Bodner was named the Coaching Director in March of this year. Chad is currently the coach of the Walla Walla College boys and girls soccer teams. He possesses USSF National B License, NSCAA Advanced National and Premier Diplomas and has experience in this club as a former player, and former Pasco High School coach. His stated goal is to return the Three Rivers Soccer Club to the elite club it has been in the past. He has been working closely with the staff at Washington Youth Soccer to establish the path forward to meet this goal.

Mike Pardini was hired as a technical advisor to assist in the recruitment of coaches, and serves as the academy director. Mr. Pardini is also the head coach of the Pasco High School boy's soccer team, leading them to a state title in 2006.

Matt Potter is a technical advisor in charge of youth development and is responsible for the direction and operation of summer youth camps. Matt is an assistant boy's soccer coach at Whitman College.

Chip Elfering is a technical advisor responsible for goal keeper training. Mr. Elfering is the head boy's soccer coach at Southridge High School.

While these gentlemen are responsible for the technical focus of our club and the development of programs much of the work is performed by volunteers. Specifically, a great deal of time and effort was put in by former Club Director Chris Smith, Teri Carr the Premier/PDL team's coordinator and Ken Miller the Select team's coordinator. Many others members of the Three Rivers Team also contribute greatly in the areas of field scheduling, uniform ordering and general management of the club. Recreational Club Directors

Position Description:

The Club Director is elected by the Board of Directors and represents their club by also becoming a member of the Board.

Each Recreational Club Director is responsible for the administration of recreational soccer within their respective club and includes the following primary responsibilities:

- Formation of recreational teams
- Placement of properly registered players
- Recruitment and management of coaches and players
- Dispute resolution involving coaches and/or players
- Provide information and resources to coaches and player families regarding the Club, it's activities and coaching tools that may be available to them
- Ensure coaches receive schedules, rosters and necessary contact information
- Keep the Board informed of issues/concerns/ trends that arise within the club as well as provide input on how to improve the overall performance of the organization

The Club Director may recruit volunteers to carry out the functions of the club and will provide the T-CYSA office staff a listing of all club volunteers to direct member questions. Club Directors leaving their position, will be asked to provide orientation and training to help properly indoctrinate the individual voted in as his/her replacement.

RICHLAND CLUB DIRECTOR – LISA SEED

RICHLAND REPORT

The fall 2008 season has been one of transition. As a newly appointed Club Director there was much to learn about the roles and responsibilities of this position. Although overwhelming and daunting at times, 44 teams were formed, 55 coaches were assigned, and 450 players were rostered. This number is slightly lower than the 2007/2008 season (approx. 30 players) for reasons unknown. One factor may be that there were a number of waitlisted players who did not get placed simply due to a shortage of coaches. Although new to the position, the challenge was met with enthusiasm and commitment as well as a desire to improve the way things were done. A coaches meeting was held to kick-off the fall season and was well attended and received. Feedback from attendees was positive and the information provided to coaches was appreciated. The season went smoothly and brought very few issues/complaints from coaches and parents, the few that did arise were resolved timely and in a manner which supported the best interests of the Club.

A special thanks to **Ryan Nielsen** and **Greg Grogan** for all of their support in helping me learn this position. Without egos or boundaries we were all able to work as a team to ensure that as many kids as possible had the opportunity to play soccer. Both were a tremendous help and the Club is extremely fortunate to have such fabulous volunteers as they “set the standard” for all volunteers within this organization. I would also like to thank our Field Coordinator, **Cindy Beaumier**, as she was diligent, supportive and responsive to all of the responsibilities that her position required.
